Who Are We?

Iona-Hope was established as a mission in 1998 by the Fort Myers Deanery under The Very Rev. Bill Dodd, and eventually located on land donated by St. Luke's Episcopal Church in Fort Myers. The Rev. John S. Adler was selected as the church planter, Vicar and Pastor.

Our first office was on Kelly Road and then moved to the shopping center where the McGregor Point Bridge Club is located. The Bridge Club was the site of our Sunday worship from January 10, 1999 until Maundy Thursday (April 20, 2000). Since that time our present site has been home.

The "Miracle of Lent, 2000" refers to the period in which the manufactured buildings, that are our original home, were completely erected, landscaped, and furnished. These buildings have proven remarkably adaptable to our present needs but we continue to view the vacant site next to us as our future home while our growth continues unabated.

The name, Iona-Hope Episcopal Church, was chosen because we are located in the lona district of the Fort Myers area and the hope is in the promises of our Lord Savoir Jesus Christ. The original Iona is an island off the west coast of Scotland upon which the Scotlish missionary Columba established a monastery in the sixth century. With twelve followers, he proceeded to Christianize Scotland. The monastery continues to exist as a focal point of spirituality to this day. The current resident wood carver carved both our altar cross and processional cross.

What Are Our Beliefs?



You are not guaranteed a seat until you speak with someone in the office or send an email and you have received a response back. Thank you.

It is a good thing to review our first 6 months of 2019. We are \$17,436 behind in revenue compared to the same time in 2018. Our expenses are \$8,495 less than in 2018 meaning we have a \$8,941 net deficit compared to the same time last year.

We have lost contributors due to death and re-location and some have reduced their pledges and these pledges have not been replaced. The bottom line is we are short revenue.

Our goal for the next 6 months is to ensure we have sufficient funds to cover all the expenses due upon completion of our Phase One construction project. We will be billed in increments tied to the percentage of the work completed.

Our audit of 2018 will be completed and submitted before the due date of September 1. The 2020 Stewardship campaign will be conducted this fall.


We are asking for a \$20 donation per person to be fully donated to Iona-Hope - split between Suzy's discretionary fund and the music program. There will be raffles with a

collects pop tabs instead of the entire aluminum can because the tabs are pure, high quality aluminum and are easier to store. Pull tabs are a simple way to recycle and help the House. Some interesting facts about the program:

- We receive the going rate for aluminum, which changes as the demand changes varying from rates of 23 to 52 cents per pound on any given period.
- We average about 450 pounds every 10 days, or approximately \$234.
- Every penny helps families stay at the House -- \$10 pays for one family for one night!
- Approximately one million pull tabs = 800 pounds
- Approximately 1,430 pull tabs = one pound
- Approximately 63,360 pull tabs = 1 mile



Iona-Hope Book Club - August 2019

The next meeting of the Iona-Hope Book Club will be Friday, August 23rd at 1:15 p.m. (please note this is the 4th Friday of the month and we usually meet on the 3rd Friday but there are 5 Fridays in the month of August 2019 so we elected to do the 23rd). Mary Beth Harper has agreed to



lead the discussion of <u>"Killers of the Flower Moon: The Osage Murders and the Birth of the FBI"</u> by David Grann (359 pages – non-fiction).

The Book:

A true-life murder mystery about one of the most monstrous crimes in American history. Author David Grann describes a series of murders that came to be known as the Osage Reign of Terror. In the early 1900s, dozens of members of the Osage Native American tribe were murdered in a vast conspiracy. These murders were motivated by the Osage's considerable wealth, a result of their relocation above major oil fields in northern Oklahoma. Over a period of many years, white members of the community orchestrated the killings and an elaborate cover-up to gain control of Osage headrights, which would entitle them to a share of the oil leases.

Intervention by the nascent Bureau of Investigation, the predecessor of the modern FBI, solved some of the murders and led to conviction of several conspirators, but many crimes remain formally unsolved to this day. Together with the Osage they began to expose one of our most sinister and racial conspiracies.

The Author:

David Grann is a #1 New York Times bestselling author and an award-winning staff writer at The New Yorker magazine. His book was a finalist for the National Book Award and a winner of the Edgar Allen Poe Award for best true crime book, a Spur Award for best work of historical nonfiction, and an Indies Choice Award for best adult nonfiction book of the year. A #1 New York Times bestseller, Killers of the Flower Moon was named one of the best books of the year by the Times, Wall Street Journal, Washington Post, Time, Entertainment and numerous other publications. Amazon named Killers of the Flower Moon the single best book of the year, and so did Shelf Awareness. The book is being adapted into a major motion picture, with Martin Scorsese slated to direct and Leonardo DiCaprio to play a role.

Touchy Topics

For many people the idea of talking about and/or dealing with the fact that we are all going to die from this life at some point or another is downright impossible. At the very least some folks tend to avoid such discussion at all costs. Please allow me to encourage you to reconsider your position on this matter.

We have a very short form here entitled "Post Death Instructions."

This form provides a number of things. First, once they are completed, it tells us who your immediate family is and how to get in touch with them if necessary. Second, it gives us a very good idea of what your wishes and desires are regarding disposition following your death. This means we can spend time talking about what kind of service you might like to have, what the readings might be, and what music might be played. You may or may not care about any of the fine details but unless you express yourself we are left trying to

figure these matters out for you. If there are family members involved, we will have to abide by their decisions. However, if you decide to express yourself by completing our very simple form and expressing your preferences. We can make it even easier on you. Just make an appointment, come to the office, and I will help you complete the form. Even if you don't want to do that then make an appointment and one of our clergy members will help you fill out the form.

Please give this topic some thought and let us know how we can be helpful to you.

Do you wonder, "What the heck is ALF?"

When looking over the list of volunteer opportunities at Iona Hope, how many of us think of the 1980's sitcom based on the misadventures of a misshapen alien stranded in Middle America when we see the listing for ALF? For a number of years Iona Hope has <u>not</u> provided outreach to Alien Life Forms; it <u>has</u>, however, been serving Christ in the community by hosting worship opportunities in two near-by Adult Living Facilities. Our service is an abbreviated Sunday Eucharist presented in the chapels of Brookdale on College and Brookdale at Cypress Lake, both Continuing Care Retirement Communities. For our brothers and sisters at these locations this their Sunday worship service and they dress for the occasion. Almost from the beginning they insisted that we collect an offering and several are pledging members of Iona Hope. Music is an important part of this service and everyone's pleasure in singing old, familiar hymns is one of the many joys experienced by our volunteers. Iona Hope prepared service books for worshippers which contain the words to these hymns and our "Service of Prayer, Praise and Holy Communion." During the service we have a brief message based on the Bible lessons for the day and pray responsive Prayers of the People. There is time for prayers for loved ones and thanks for blessings received as well as healing. After the confession, passing of the peace, and the Lord's Prayer, the sacrament of Eucharist is administered to all who wish to receive it.

All of us involved in ALF agree that this is a ministry that gives back to us much more that we give to it. We go out in pairs and every team brings its own unique flavor to the structured service. Each person brings different gifts to this ministry, but we all share a desire to communicate our faith in God and the love shown to us by Jesus Christ. Our goals include the wish to bring comfort and hope to our congregants but also to encourage them to continue to grow in their faith journeys. In doing this our own faith and growth is strengthened and expanded. Some of us have the gift of always remembering people's names. Others enjoy interpreting the Bible readings for the day. Several have a healing touch which physically communicates God's love and compassion. Those blessed with lovely voices are quick to raise a glad song. For all of us the act of sharing the Eucharist in this intimate way is both blessed and blessing

You, too, are a part of our ALF services. The Eucharistic Elements we use were blessed at our altar at lona Hope. In our services we petition God, just as our congregation does in the nave at lona Hope: "We pray for your church throughout the world....Unite us in your truth and love...." What Service do you go to?


Typically, this is one of the most frequent sayings when you meet someone at church for the first time.

COLUMBARIUM INFORMATION

What is a columbarium?

A columbarium is a structure that is comprised of a group of compartments (known as "niches") designed to repose cremation urns. Each niche can accommodate two urns.

The columbarium is retained within a wall (known as a housing structure) that is constructed of building materials complementary to the existing architecture of the church, allowing the project to look as if it is an intended part of the physical plant.

What are the benefits of a church columbarium?

Creating a columbarium ministry at Iona-Hope will allow us to fulfill the centuries-old obligation of serving from baptism to death. As the rite of baptism welcomed members into the church community, the centuries-old rite of Christian burial offered congregants a final homecoming and provided comfort to the living, with the knowledge their loved ones were near their spiritual gathering place. A columbarium will revive this churchyard tradition.

- It is a visible sign that the church cares for its members.
- It provides comfort to the family having a memorial to their deceased loved ones at the church.
- It provides a more favorable option as compared to other methods it is economical, theologically sound and environmentally friendly.
- Offers a convenient way to handle pre-need concerns, relieving the surviving family of difficult decisions.

In addition to meeting these needs a columbarium ministry will strengthen ties between church and family. Family members are more likely to maintain their connection to the church, as visitations are now made easier. No longer will they have to pack up the station wagon and drive to a secular, often distant cemetery to visit a loved one's final resting place. The family can visit and reflect before or after service.

This ministry unites the church, both past and present. Those who have come before us are once again part of the church and the entire community of faith can join in celebrating Christmas service, Easter sunrise service, weekly Sabbath services as well as weddings and other significant events.

We WILL be offering a pre-construction sale of niches beginning between 9/15 and 9/30 and ending on 12/31/19. More information and pricing will be announced in future bulletins and newsletters.


Iona Hope's One More Time Thrift Store, is one of the larger contributors to Iona-Hope yearly income.
