Vestry received LIFE report from Debbie, Nehemiah Action April 9 at South Ft. Myers High

School, lots of tickets, encouraged all to attend.

Vestry received update on New Facilities from Fr. John, discussed timeline for construction, construction to start July 1 continue into November.

Vestry received Sr. Warden Report from Joe. Day Spring retreat May 11; Mardi Gras fundraiser a big success, netted \$8,300; party for Thrift Shop volunteers held, big success, everyone enjoyed.

Vestry discussed Columbarium Committee, Al Parker offered to assist with legal work, Gordon McIntosh would be happy to be a part of committee, Fr. Ray advised 4-5 people at most, enough to do the work, Debbie will serve on committee.

Vestry received Financial Report from Debbie, pledge income up, non-pledge and plate income down. Thrift Shop income down, furniture donations needed, would be appreciated. Money market account with Midwest One Bank opened with \$65,000 from Capital Campaign Fund.

Ronald McDonald House of Southwest Florida

collects pop tabs instead of the entire aluminum can because the tabs are pure, high quality aluminum and are easier to store. Pull tabs are a simple way to recycle and help the House. Some interesting facts about the program:

- We receive the going rate for aluminum, which changes as the demand changes - varying from rates of 23 to 52 cents per pound on any given period.
- We average about 450 pounds every 10 days, or approximately \$234.
- Every penny helps families stay at the House -- \$10 pays for one family for one night!
- Approximately one million pull tabs = 800 pounds
- Approximately 1,430 pull tabs = one pound
- Approximately 63,360 pull tabs = 1 mile

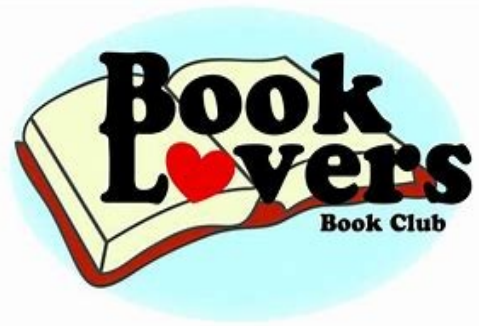

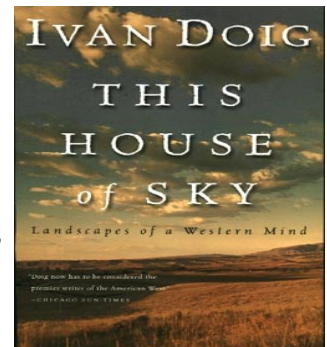


The Book:

Author Doig brings us into the rugged wilderness of western Montana among the sheepherders and denizens of small-town saloons and valley ranches. What he deciphers from his past with piercing clarity is not only a raw sense of land and how it shapes us but also of the ties to our mothers and fathers, to those who love us, and our inextricable connection to those values in our search for intimacy, independence, love, and family. A powerfully told story, *This House of Sky* is at once especially American and universal in its ability to awaken a longing for an explicable past.

The Author:

Ivan Doig was born in White Sulphur Springs, Montana, in 1939... grew up along the Rocky Mountain Front where much of his writing takes place... first book, the highly acclaimed memoir *This House of Sky*, was a finalist for the National Book Award... former ranch hand, newspaperman, and magazine editor, Doig is a graduate of Northwestern University where he received bachelor's and master's degrees in journalism... he also holds a Ph.D. in history from the University of Washington. He lives in Seattle with his wife Carol, who taught literature of the American West.

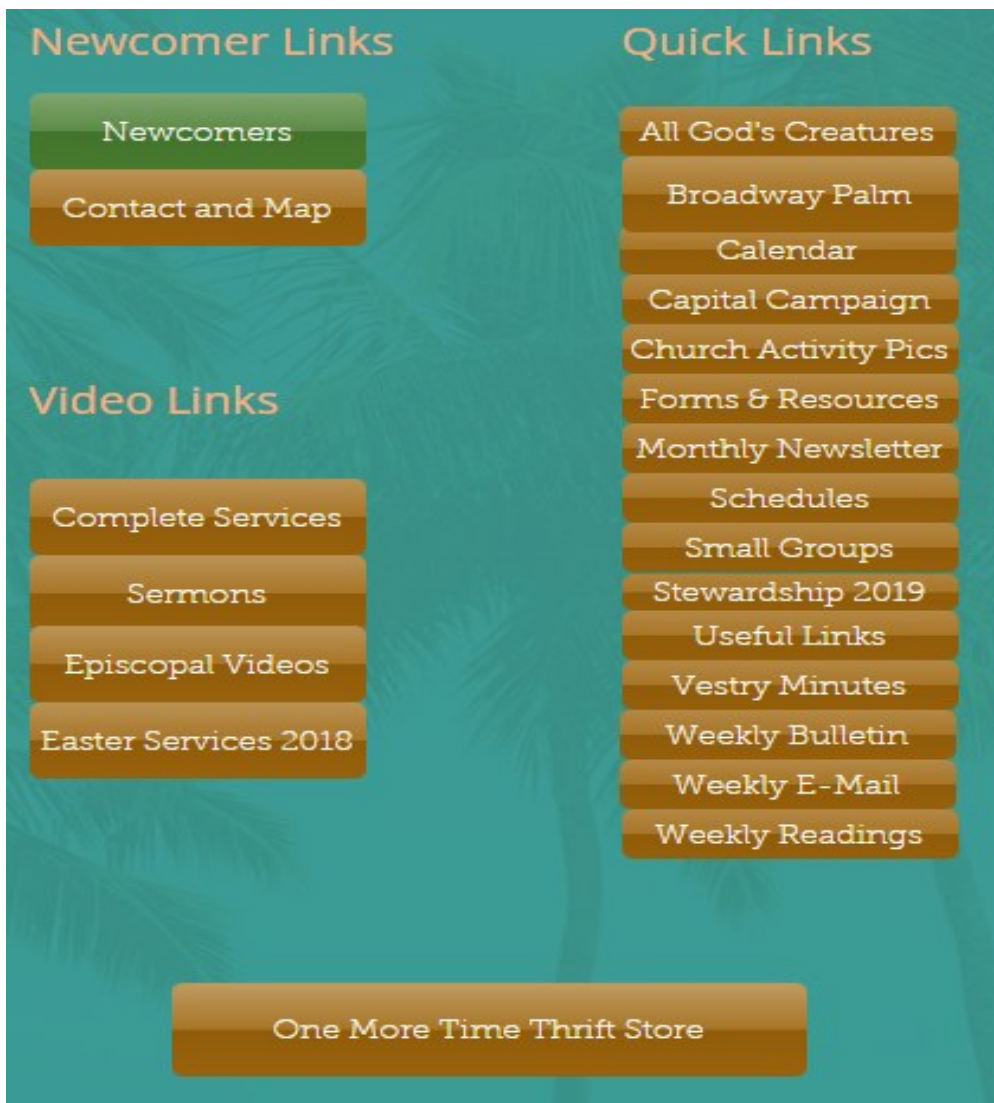

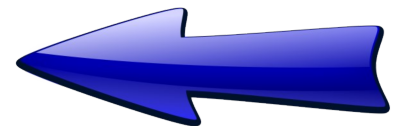
